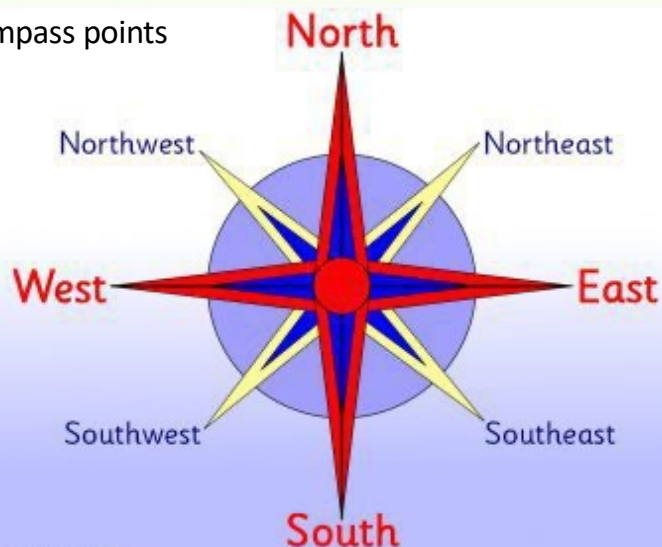

1	latitude	The distance north or south of the equator
2	longitude	The distance east or west of the prime meridian at Greenwich
3	time zone	An area which has the same time for legal, commercial or social reasons
4	compass	An instrument that shows the direction of magnetic North
5	continent	An large solid area of land
6	hemisphere	Half of the earth above or below the equator (northern or southern)
