In Year 5, they have been making Valentine's Day cards and in Year 1, they decorated lolly sticks for a whole school project.



Remote learning this term

Over the course of 6 weeks, we have continued to adapt and improve the remote learning provision for our children learning at home through Teams and Tapestry. This, of course, has been in addition to teachers teaching over 100 critical worker and vulnerable children, who are attending school each day. The teachers have been planning and delivering lessons at school and remotely, on alternating weeks. In addition, we have increased the number of recorded lessons, so that children at home can work at their own pace and at a time of the day which best suits the family.

Many of the older children have become very proficient at using Teams for supporting their own learning, using the private messaging facility to contact teachers and reply to advice and feedback. It has enabled these children to manage their learning themselves, ask for support and advice and to give teachers a good idea of how they are getting on with the work set.

We are also so grateful to our parents, for their commitment to supporting the school with the home learning, this term. It has not been easy and many of our staff, as parents too, know the challenges of trying to keep everyone motivated and engaged. Do encourage your child to private message the teacher, so that they can directly support with any issues.

Class Meets

After half term, all children will have the opportunity to meet regularly online with their class teacher and other children through Teams, or for Reception and Nursery, through Zoom calls. For children at home, this will mean they can catch up with the teacher up to three times a week. Please read the letter from Miss Mann, which was sent out this week, to find your child's times for these weekly meets.
