Maintenance Fund

For parents new to the school, or as a reminder to all our parents, the Maintenance Fund of £35 per child can be paid on ParentPay. Please see last week's letter which reminds parents that Church of England schools have to pay towards repairs and replacements for boilers, heating systems, roof repairs. etc. Our insurance scheme, into which parents pay, helps to ensure these works can be carried out.

Remote learning at

St. Andrew's School



Since the school closure in March, the staff have been working extremely

hard to ensure children who are at home isolating or waiting for test results, have access to quality learning at home. In order to do this, it is vital that parents and children are able to successfully access Microsoft Teams in Years 1 to 6. In the event of a child, class or whole year group having to isolate, or if your child is waiting for a test result, all remote learning will be delivered via Teams, after the second day of the child being off school. This work is to replace the lessons at school, where possible. We are pleased that the vast majority of families are now able to access remote learning online. If you are having issues with your device, please do let a member of staff know. We expect all children to keep up with work at home and their homework, too. Thank you.

Wearing masks

We are continually monitoring our health and safety procedures, in order to keep children and adults safe. As from last Wednesday, we expect all adults and older children collecting siblings to wear face coverings whilst on the school grounds. Thank you to all parents, grandparents and secondary school siblings, for helping us with this. Please continue to keep 2 metres away from each other when lining up and when leaving the playground.

Online parent meetings

We intend to go ahead with our Autumn term meeting with parents. **This term, parent meetings will be booked online in November.** Parents will be able to book a slot to talk to the teacher via a videoconferencing system. More details and a letter will follow soon, to explain how to use it.
