Starting Reception


- Starting Reception is a big step for both children and parents/carers and we will support you to ensure that this is a positive transition.
- Come and Play sessions before the summer give the children a chance to meet the staff and visit the setting. It also provides a great talk point during the summer before your child starts school.
- Children will begin Reception in a staggered start. This helps children get used to a new routine, settle into their class and to make new friends.



Drop Off & Pick Up


Mornings


Preparing for starting Reception

- Put on and fasten their coats
- Take jumpers and shoes & socks on and off
- Use a knife and fork
- Talk to an adult about their needs
- Our staff are always on hand to help the children




At the start we will be working on ...

- Building confidence with new experiences such as lunchtime




A typical morning



EYFS Framework

The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) promotes teaching and learning to ensure children's 'school readiness' and gives children the broad range of knowledge and skills that provide the right foundation for good future progress through school and life.

Children have plentiful opportunities to learn through play. As the year progresses the amount of time children spend in child-initiated play will reduce to allow for a more structured learning style to ensure they are developing skills needed to embrace the Key Stage One curriculum.




Lunchtimes

- Everyone is entitled to school lunches as part of the Universal Free School meals offer. You can also provide a packed lunch if you prefer.
- Children can change from packed lunch to school dinner or vice-versa at half term. We are a bit more relaxed with this rule in the first few weeks.
- We have children with severe allergies we are a nut free school.

Snack

- Every child needs to bring a water bottle each day.




Lunchtimes

- Reception staff team stay with children in lunch hall for first few sessions.
- Team of Play Leaders who supervise the children at lunchtime.
- Y5/6 children Games Makers who help in the hall and outside on the playground

Staggered introduction to lunchtime play:

- Start in YR garden area
- Move to playing in the MUGA (Multi Use Games Area)
- Move to sharing the playground/field with KS1




Uniform & Equipment

- Logo items available from Smiths Schoolwear


PE

If Your Child Is Unwell

- If your child is unwell during the school day we will contact you to collect your child.
- Please make sure contact details are kept up to date.
- If your child has been vomiting or suffering from diarrhoea. Please keep them away from school for 48 hours, from their last bout of illness.
- In all cases absence please leave a phone message.
- If your child has a medical appointment during school hours, please let us have a copy of the appointment letter. Please ensure routine appointments are made during the holiday periods.




Governing Body

So far, this year will be able to claim approximately £2,500 from HMRC in Gift Aid contributions.




Our PTA





Breakfast & After School Clubs


- Detailed information in your pack about applying



Extra Curricular Clubs


- We have outside providers who run clubs from our school




Tapestry

Parents are also able to upload pictures and videos of their child at home.


We have a focus week system, when observations about your child will be uploaded to Tapestry. We also share additional information about our learning and topics and put a weekly homework activity on Tapestry.


