

## Phonics and Pronunciation

1	IN	sound in cinq & cinquante
2	I	sound in Famille & Fille
3	ILLE	sound in famille
4	IQUE	sound in unique
5	Silent letters	The final consonant (s) is not pronounced in appelle, ans, sœurs, mes grandparents, les or parents. This is often but not always the case in French.
6	Elision :	In je m'appelle/ il s'appelle/ elle s'appelle/ j'ai. This is when the last letter of a word ends in a vowel, and so is dropped and replaced with an apostrophe because the first letter of the next word also starts with a vowel or a silent 'h'.
