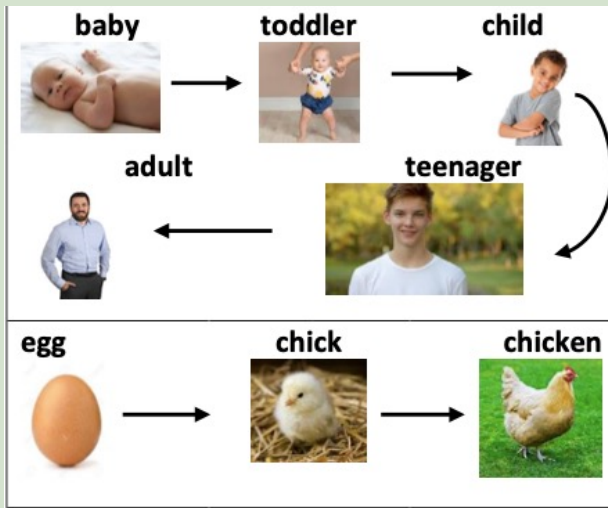

## What I already know:

There are 6 main animal groups: mammals, reptiles, birds, amphibians, fish, insects

Humans are mammals. Humans are omnivores.

## Key Vocabulary

living	Living things are plants and animals.
dead	Dead plants, dead animals, parts of plants no longer attached.
never alive	Objects made of rock, plastic or paper have never been alive
habitats	The place where an animal or plant lives and provides their basic needs – shelter, food and water.
micro-habitats	A very small habitat e.g. a log that woodlice live under.
food chain	A food chain tells us who eats who
