
Parent Survey and Maintenance Fund

Thank you to all the parents who completed the **Parent Survey** which closes today. We have received 107 responses. We will be collating the results and publishing them after Easter.

Our Maintenance Fund payments are slowly increasing. The payment has been set up ParentPay so you can pay in instalments, to make payments more manageable for everyone. So far, 58% of families have paid. Thank you for your support.

What has been happening around the school?

We are always keen to show our school community the wide range of learning opportunities, which take place in one half term alone! Teachers continually develop their knowledge and understanding in at least 11 subject areas, in order to deliver an engaging and diverse curriculum. Our Subject Leaders work extremely hard to support the teaching and learning in these areas.





Year 5 children have started their new history unit about the Kingdom of Benin. They have been analysing artefacts about the culture of the people from the West African region, ready for their trip to the British Museum in two weeks. Meanwhile, in Design Technology lessons, **Year 6** have been making wooden frames for their automata toys, which will be a moving window display for a shop of their choice. They will need to explore and experiment with a variety of cams before assembling the mechanism.

As part of their art unit, the **Year 2** children have been learning a range of techniques with clay, using their hands and special tools. Last week they made pinch pots, which look amazing!

We have all been so excited to see these wonderful creatures emerge from their shells, right in front of the children - even during a lesson! Homework on Teams

Our Microsoft Teams platform allows teachers to upload homework and other work for the children in Years 1 to 6. Teachers write a paragraph on the class general page, which gives an explanation of the homework set. In normal term time, teachers do not use the 'chat' function with pupils or parents, as the children are able to see their teacher on the Monday, if there is an issue.
