Last week, we wrote about some important requests at the start of term. Here is our feedback so far:

Get your child to school on time. Much improved this week! We saw fewer families arriving after the gates have closed. We know that occasionally things happen in the mornings. However, our learning time begins straight after the register is taken, so we need all children to be there. The office staff continue to monitor lateness and families who are persistently late. A reminder that our gates open between **8.45am and 8.55am**.

Read, read, read at school! Reading sessions and reading opportunities take place across the school day. Our phonics programmes have been taking place across Reception and KS1 classes, including additional practice for those children who often require a different approach. Carefully chosen, high quality literature is evident in all classrooms, with one of the favourite parts of the day being story time. Check out the curriculum letters on the website, to see which books are being read in your child's class.

Read, read, read at home! There is no better conversation to be heard than children discussing books; characters, issues, plot lines and endings. Reading with or to someone at home builds confidence, promotes creativity and improves literacy skills. We encourage all children in all year groups to read at home, at every opportunity. Thank you for helping with this.

What's been happening around the school?

As part of their science unit called 'Rocks, Soils and Fossils', **Year 3** children looked at a soil sample in class. They then went outside to investigate soil in the school grounds
