The role Judas, Peter, the women and Mary Magdalene play in the Easter story and what it means to betray, deny reject those who are different.

That Holy Communion links to the Last Supper and describe what differences it makes to Christian's lives.

That the season of Lent links to Jesus' life and know the effects that rituals have on a believer's life.
