### School Day

- We have a 'soft start' from 8:45 a.m. and the gates are closed at 8:55 a.m.
- Upon arrival, the children will have an activity to complete. This could be an activity on the board or editing a piece of work from the day before.
- We have registration at 8:55 a.m. and then go to Collective Worship.
- We have a 15-minute morning and afternoon break time, as well as an hour's break at lunchtime.
- We say a prayer before lunch and before the end of the day.
- Gates open at 3:25 p.m. and school finishes at 3:30 p.m.



### **Uniform Reminders**

#### Ties

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KS2 – A standard tie to be worn from Year 1 upwards. Indoor PE kit to be brought into school – white t shirt and dark blue shorts.

#### Jewellery

Apart from small gold or silver, round stud earrings in pierced ears, no jewellery should be worn in school. It is advisable to remove earrings on PE days. Nail varnish, make up and temporary tattoos should not be worn.

#### Hairstyles

Long hair must be tied back. No patterns, lines or logos should be shaved into the hair. Please see the Uniform Policy for more details.

As a Church of England School, we follow the RE syllabus created by the London Diocesan Board.



## Multiplication Tables Check (MTC)

In Year 4, children are expected to take part in a national assessment testing their times tables knowledge. By the end of Year 4, children should be able to recall times table facts up to 12 x 12.

- The assessment will take place in June
- You will be informed about the exact dates closer to the time
- The assessment is completed on an iPad.
- We will have access to official practice tests closer to the time
- We have already started to use Monday afternoons as a designated time to practice applying their times tables knowledge

## Mental Health and Well-being

Pupils' emotional well-being forms a central part of our ethos school in and out of the classroom. We know that children learn best when they feel safe, calm and secure and have a trusted adult to go to, if needed.

Some of the ways in which the school is championing well-being:

- We have a Senior Mental Health Lead to oversee our plan for supporting good mental health and well-being
- We have a school governor who takes the lead on mental health and well-being
- Our PSHE curriculum has been developed over the past two years and is overseen by our PSHE Leader
- PSHE Themes include Family and Relationships and Health and Well-being
- PSHE lessons are taught weekly
- Circle time sessions also happen regularly in all classes
- Mindfulness techniques are taught and used to help to restore focus and calm
- 1:1 or small group targeted interventions offer support to key children





# - Reading

#### Reading at home

At St. Andrew's School, we know how important it is for children to read and share stories at home. Therefore, we expect parents to support their child with reading every day.

#### Reading in Year 4

Children will have the offer to read for pleasure at least once a week in class. Most children will be expected to be reading books of a Year 4 level and to be able to discuss what they have been reading with an adult.

#### **Reading records**

There is a reading record book, for children and parents to complete. Your children can write in this as they are now expected to have a greater ownership of their learning. This will be checked once a week, to ensure regular reading is taking place (once a day).

### Homework

In addition to daily reading, homework will be set once a week on Microsoft Teams. Your child will have their own log in for this. Please see the class teacher if your child is unable to log on.

Maths, English or another area of the curriculum, to support work already undertaken in class.

The task may involve the use the Purple Mash or MyMaths platforms but will always be detailed on Teams.

Homework is set on Friday and should be completed by the following Wednesday.

Please speak to the class teacher if you have queries about homework.
