School Day

- We have a 'soft start' from 8:45 a.m. and the gates are closed at 8:55 a.m.
- We have registration at 8:55 a.m. and then go to Collective Worship.
- We have a 15-minute morning and afternoon break time, as well as an hour's break at lunchtime.
- We say a prayer before lunch and before the end of the day.
- Gates open at 3:25 p.m. and school finishes at 3:30 p.m.



Uniform Reminders

Ties

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KS1 – A standard tie to be worn from Year 1 upwards. Indoor PE kit to be brought into school – white t shirt and dark blue shorts.

Jewellery

Apart from small gold or silver, round stud earrings in pierced ears, no jewellery should be worn in school. It is advisable to remove earrings on PE days. Nail varnish, make up and temporary tattoos should not be worn.

Hairstyles

Long hair must be tied back. No patterns, lines or logos should be shaved into the hair. Please see the Uniform Policy for more details.



Our Curriculum

In Years 1 to 6, children are taught the National Curriculum, this includes;

- English
- Maths
- Science
- History & Geography
- Art & Design Technology
- Computing
- Music
- French (KS2 onwards)
- Personal, Social and Health Education (PSHE)
- Physical Education (PE)
- Religious Education (RE)

As a Church of England School, we follow the RE syllabus created by the London Diocesan Board.



Mental Health and Well-being

Pupils' emotional well-being forms a central part of our ethos school in and out of the classroom. We know that children learn best when they feel safe, calm and secure and have a trusted adult to go to, if needed.

Some of the ways in which the school is championing well-being:

- We have a Senior Mental Health Lead to oversee our plan for supporting good mental health and well-being
- We have a school governor who takes the lead on mental health and well-being
- Our PSHE curriculum has been developed over the past two years and is overseen by our PSHE Leader
- PSHE Themes include Family and Relationships and Health and Well-being
- PSHE lessons are taught weekly
- Circle time sessions also happen regularly in all classes
- Mindfulness techniques are taught and used to help to restore focus and calm
- 1:1 or small group targeted interventions offer support to key children



Reading

Reading at home At St. Andrew's School, we know how important it is for children to read and share stories at home. Therefore, we expect parents to support their child with reading every day.

Reading in Year 1 Children read a decodable book matched to their current knowledge, 2-3 times per week with an adult in school. This book is then set within the Collins E-Library for children to read to an adult at home. The expectation is that they are reading with 80% fluency before the book comes home.
Children also bring home a sharing book to be enjoyed with an adult.
Reading records There is a reading record book, for parents to complete about the e-book. This will be checked once a week and should be sent back into school with your sharing book on a Thursday.
Your feedback is really appreciated.

Reading Bear

Every week, a child will bring home our class reading bear along with a packet of biscuits and a sachet of hot chocolate. They choose their favourite book to share with the bear and then write a sentence to say why they picked it, and draw a picture in the notebook provided.





Homework

In addition to daily reading, homework will be set once a week on Microsoft Teams. Your child will have their own log in for this. Please see the class teacher if your child is unable to log on.

Maths, English or another area of the curriculum, to support work already undertaken in class.

The task may involve the use the Purple Mash or MyMaths platforms but will always be detailed on Teams.

Homework is set on Friday and should be completed by the following Wednesday.
