

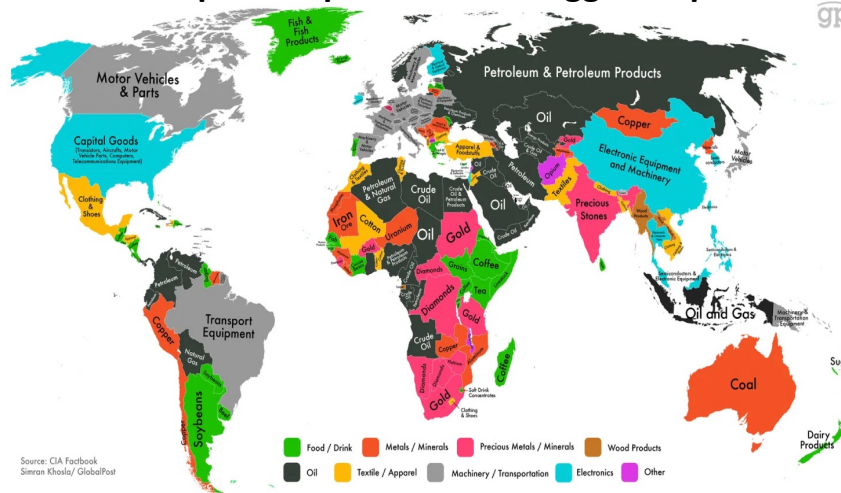

Import	to bring goods into a country for sale
Export	to send goods to another country for sale
Trade	the action of buying and selling goods and services
Fair trade	trade between developed and developing countries where fair prices are paid to the producers
Recycle	to convert waste into reusable materials
Raw materials	the basic material from which a product is made
Man-made	material that is manufactured through human effort
Sustainable	to be able to continue over a period of time
Economy	the production and consumption of goods and services, the supply of money
Biome (climate zone)	a large area/ecosystem characterised by its collection of flora (plants) and fauna (animals), as well as weather

Fair Trade

Fair trade sets out to ensure a fair deal for farmers. This includes creating opportunities for food producers in developing countries, ensuring trade practices are fair and working conditions are safe.

The global supply chain

This is the journey travelled by clothing, food items and other products through different factories, suppliers and warehouses before ending up as the finished product we buy in shops.
