In Year 2 we will:

- 1) Know that sewing is a method of joining fabric and that different stitches can be used.
- 2) Understand the importance of tying a knot after sewing the final stitch.
- 3) Know that a thimble can be used to protect my fingers when sewing.
- 4) Design a pouch.
- 5) Thread a needle and sew running-stitch.
- 6) Neatly pin and cut fabric using a template.
- 7) Decorate a pouch using fabric glue or running stitch.
- 8) Evaluate the stitching on a partner's work.
- 9) Identify aspects of a partner's work that we particularly like and explaining why.

Vocabulary which will be new in Year 2

Pouch = a small bag made to keep objects safe and to be carried easily.

Fabric = cloth or other material produced by weaving together cotton, nylon, wool, silk, or other threads.

Sew = to join or fasten with stitches using a needle and thread.

Running-stitch = a simple style of sewing in a straight line with no overlapping.

Template = a stencil / shape which you use to help you draw a shape more easily on material.

Knot = a join made by tying two pieces of thread together.

Thimble = a small cap to cover and protect your finger when sewing.
