— School Day

- We have a 'soft start' from 8:45 a.m. and the gates are closed at 8:55 a.m.
- We kindly request that mobile phones are not used at pick up and drop off times. This is in line with the Enfield 'Smartphone Free School' initiative which starts this September.
- We have registration at 8:55 a.m. and then go to Collective Worship.
- We have a 15-minute morning and afternoon break time, as well as an hour at lunchtime.
- At break time the children are no longer provided with a snack, so please send your child in with fruit for their morning break.
- We say a prayer before lunch and before the end of the day.
- Gates open at 3:25 p.m. and school finishes at 3:30 p.m.



— Uniform Reminders

General

We are a uniform-wearing school and all children are expected to wear the correct uniform every day.

Jewellery

Apart from small gold or silver, round stud earrings in pierced ears, no jewellery should be worn in school. It is advisable to remove earrings on PE days. Nail varnish, make up and temporary tattoos should not be worn.

Hairstyles

Long hair must be tied back. No patterns, lines or logos should be shaved into the hair. Please see the Uniform Policy for more details.



— Our Curriculum

In Years 1 to 6, children are taught the National Curriculum, this includes;

- English
- Maths
- Religious Education (RE)
- Science
- History & Geography
- Art & Design Technology
- Computing
- Music
- French (KS2 onwards)
- Personal, Social and Health Education (PSHE)
- Physical Education (PE)

As a Church of England School,
we follow the RE syllabus created by the London Diocesan Board.



— Mental Health and Well-being

Pupils' emotional well-being forms a central part of our ethos school in and out of the classroom. We know that children learn best when they feel safe, calm and secure and have a trusted adult to go to, if needed. Some of the ways in which the school is championing well-being:

- We have a Senior Mental Health Lead to oversee our plan for supporting good mental health and well-being
- Our PSHE curriculum has been developed over the past three years and is overseen by our PSHE Leader. Themes include *Family and Relationships* and *Health and Well-being*
- PSHE lessons are taught weekly
- Circle time sessions also happen regularly in all classes
- Mindfulness techniques are taught and used to help to restore focus and calm
- 1:1 or small group targeted interventions offer support to key children
- We work closely with organisations such as MYME (My Young Minds Enfield)



Attendance

We all know that good attendance is essential for all children to have the best chance of success now and later in life.

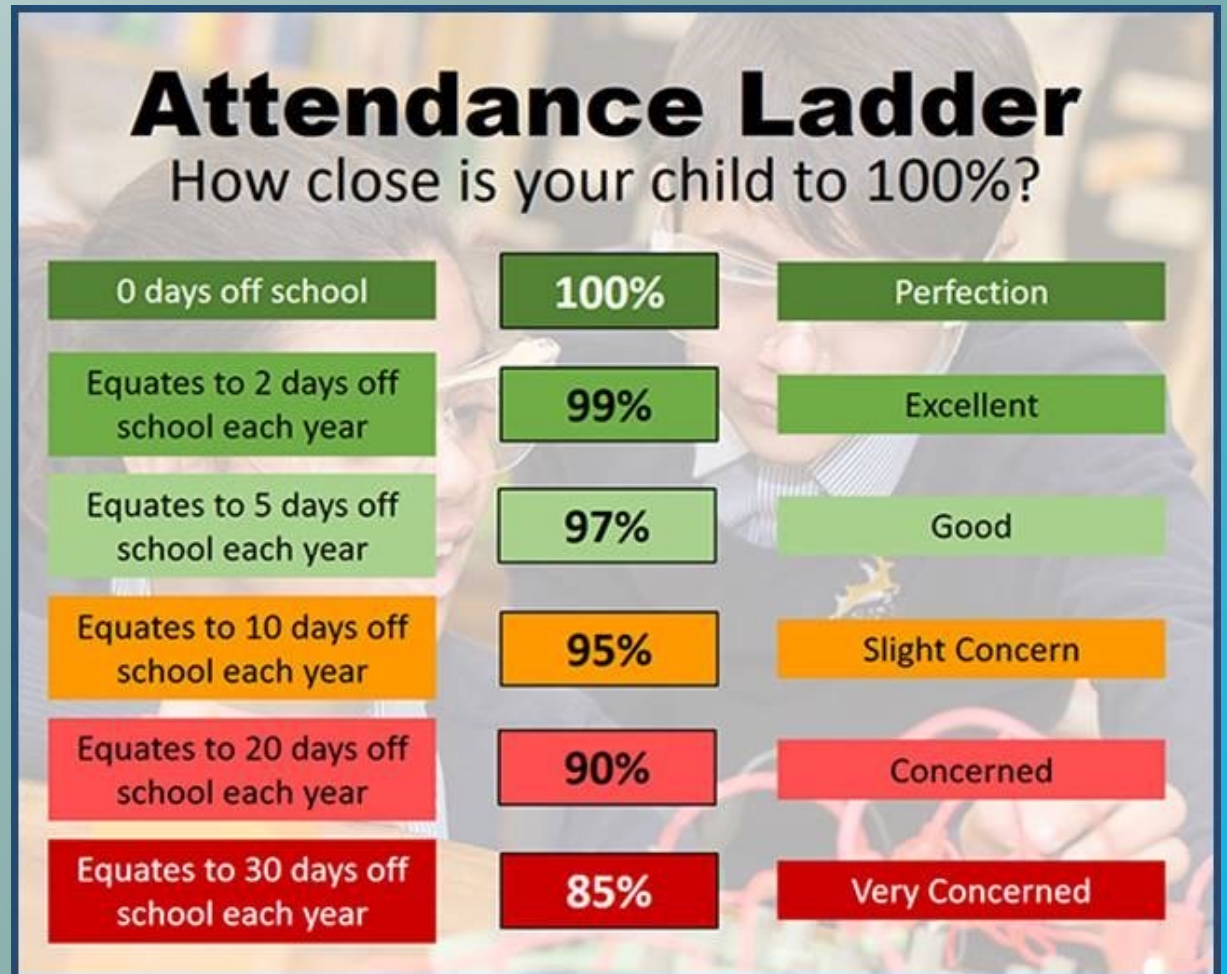
Attendance at school is compulsory and is monitored very closely.

If your child is absent even for one day a week, they miss:

1 opportunity to gather with the whole school in Collective Worship.

3 opportunities to play with friends in the playground.

4 to 5 lessons of learning.



Reading

Reading at home

At St. Andrew's School, we know how important it is for children to read and share stories and books at home. Therefore, we expect parents to support their child with reading every day.

Reading books in Year 3

Children will be either reading a book aligned to their level and are banded. Alongside these books, your child may have a picture book which may be above your child's current ability but are for you to read with them, thus exposing them to new words and vocabulary.

As your child's reading progresses through the term, they will become a 'free reader' where they choose their own book from the reading corners in the classroom (with guidance).

Reading records – On their way!

There is a reading record book, for children and parents to complete.

It is a place for you and your child to tell the teacher about their reading journey.

This will be checked once a week, to ensure regular reading is taking place.

Homework

In addition to daily reading, homework will be set once a week on Microsoft Teams. Your child will have their own log in for this. All login details will be in the children's Reading Records.

Maths, English or another area of the curriculum, to support work already undertaken in class.

The task may involve the use the Purple Mash or MyMaths platforms but will always be detailed on Teams. If your child has a question about the homework, he/she can see the teacher on the Monday. Please do not message on Teams, as this facility is not always checked.

Homework is set on Friday and should be completed by the following Wednesday.



— Enrichment Activities

At St. Andrew's all children take part in a wide range of in school and off site experiences. Last year, there were over 40 trips, events or workshops across the school. Such events will include:

- Local visits linked to curriculum areas
- Visits to London and local area
- Trips include: The Natural History Museum, Alexandra Palace and local walks
- Use of the school grounds for fieldwork in science and geography
- Recorders in the Spring term
- Leading the Christmas Service at St. Andrew's Church
- Extra-curricular clubs run by staff and outside providers
- Themed weeks such as Parliament Week (for Year 6) and Arts Week

Outdoor PE

Outdoor PE takes place on **Wednesday** with Coach Kymani. Kymani Nelson is well known to the children, and he works across the school, in all year groups. Children come to school in their PE kit on **Wednesday**.

Indoor PE
