Children across the school learn about their environment

Our back to school unit for the whole school this year uses three beautiful books, which centre around the theme of community and environment. Each class has been reading one of three books;

Through carefully planned lessons, teachers have used these books to stimulate discussion and debate about our own community and environment; something very much on the minds of the older children.
