Back to school means lots of reminders!

Get your child to school on time. Our gates open between **8.45 and 8.55am.** The register is taken promptly, ready for classes to begin lessons. Sadly, a few families have been regularly late and this means the child is marked absent. It can also be embarrassing for a child to have to enter the classroom after everyone else.

Read, read! Your child needs to be read to and have lots of opportunities to hear and read stories at home. The teachers and support staff are working really hard to create language rich environments, to enable all children to develop a love of reading.

Correct uniform and PE kits. The children have started the term looking very smart with correct uniform and shoes. Please remember that your child needs to bring in a plain white t shirt and blue shorts for indoor PE. Only stud earrings to be worn, for safety reasons.

Drop off and pick up times. These sessions are a lot smoother now that children and families know which entrance to enter and exit. Year 1 and 2 families are asked to stand well behind the line on the playground, so that the teachers can see everyone.

Ex-pupils and older siblings. It is always lovely to see our ex-pupils. However, there are far too many coming onto the school premises at 3.30pm. **We politely ask parents of older children to wait outside the gates,** unless they are the one collecting a sibling. There is no need for 3 or 4 people to collect a child and we simply do not have the space. Thank you for your cooperation with this.
